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

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## Junior League of Columbus 69th Annual Bargain Box Sale

Bargain Box, Central Ohio's oldest and largest rummage sale, has raised nearly \$2 million to support the community projects of the Junior League since 1949. Over 5,000 volunteer hours were spent on planning, setup and execution of the event.

2017's Bargain Box was a year of a few firsts. Bargain Box took place on October 20-22, 2017 with help from our sponsor, Big Lots. For the first time, the League was able to use the same space as a warehouse to collect donations and to hold the sale. The Friday pre-sale was a big hit as over 200 shoppers lined up outside of the doors waiting for the sale to begin. Turnout for the pre-sale night was more than double the size of last year's. Not only did shoppers get a chance to get a first look at everything, but there was also a nacho bar provided by Chuy's as well as beverages provided by Weiland's.

On Saturday, many shoppers returned to check out even more deals. Shoppers also shared some of their favorite finds and talked about how many years they've been to the sale. This was also the first year that we did a third day of the sale with the bag sales making a return! After the event, Star House, Compassion Outreach Ministries of Ohio, St. Stephen's and Goodwill were some of the organizations who benefited from our leftover donations.


### Vision


# HOLIDAY EXTRAVAGANZA




# 13TH ANNUAL HOLIDAY TOUR OF HOMES

## ENGLISH HOUSE UPDATES

In 2017, the Junior League of Columbus worked with the Columbus Foundation to take funds from our investments to make major improvements to the outside of the English House. This included new roof, drainage, windows, and new paint. The Columbus Foundation also provided a contractor, Jay Panzer, to oversee the work and help find the contractors to complete the work. Jay's support throughout this process was irreplaceable!

In addition to helping us complete this exterior work, Jay was able to help secure an additional grant for the unrestricted funds from the Columbus Foundation to help make improvements to the inside of the house this included upstairs HVAC, interior paint, replacing ceiling tiles, and carpet. It also included eliminating the driveway/curb cut and repair, completing sidewalk modifications to remove the section at driveway and adjacent and replace w/ concrete, and finally repairing the retaining walls. We are in the final stages in completing these renovations in 2018 and are so grateful to the Columbus Foundation for being a wonderful partner in these much-needed repairs and improvements.

A Women's Leadership Series

Leadership and Lattes is designed to speak to every individual – at any level of leadership – to bridge professional relationships, open minds to new perspectives and facilitate lasting connections. The second annual Leadership and Lattes was held on January 18, 2017 at the Boat House Restaurant at Confluence Park. This event focused on building women leaders in the Columbus community by bridging established leaders with women of all ages and featured a panel discussion from three of Columbus' most influential and notable leaders.

Almost 70 people (League members as well as a large contingent of community members) were in attendance. The Junior League of Columbus welcomed employees from Eastman and Smith, who was a table sponsor. Those in attendance were able to hear from Jane Grote Abell, CEO of Donatos; Kelley Griesmer, Columbus Foundation and founder of Pelotonia; and Elizabeth Brown, Columbus City Council.

The panel told their stories and how they got to be where they are and offer recommendations to the audience. The women discussed their leadership roles and experiences in their respective fields of corporate, nonprofit, and government work. Jane focused on the 4 C's of Success (Character, Courage, Conviction, Compassion) from her book "The Missing Piece". Afterwards, Jane held a meet & greet book signing to allow guests to speak with her and sign their personal copies of "The Missing Piece." All proceeds of the book benefited the Reeb Avenue Center. It was truly a great night, where the audience wished we could hear more!

The 2018 Leadership and Lattes, presented by Kendra Scott, was held on January 18 at the Boat House Restaurant at Confluence Park. The panel included CEO Lisa Ingram of White Castle, Executive Director Vicki Bowen Hewes of Dress for Success, and Judge Beth Gill of Franklin County Juvenile Courts. Hewes stated that she was "enthusiastic to be a part of such a meaningful event."

Event sponsor, Kendra Scott offered all attendees a special shopping discount and incentive. ## Kelton House Updates



### Kelton House Gala 2017

The 2017 Kelton House Gala raised approximately \$18,500 for continuing Kelton House's mission of providing historical education and preserving decorative arts in Central Ohio. The Secret Garden theme was enhanced by the donation of greenery by Dean's Greenhouse, which provided a garden escape atmosphere that set the mood for the evening.

Performers Brian Michael Smith and the John Vermeulen Octet further amplified the mood with spirit-lifting big band music. Guests dined on a taste bud tingling menu from Bleu & Fig that included: Thick Cut Brown Sugar Candied Bacon Tower, Avocado Spring Roll with Sesame Chili Sauce and Pork Tenderloin Sliders with Fig Horseradish Aioli on Petite French Roll. The dessert bundtins from Nothing Bundt Cake were particularly popular with guests. The signature cocktail, a sparkling strawberry rose sangria, was enjoyed by all who partook in the delightful concoction.

### Kelton House Participates in the Discovery District Trolley Hop

On Saturday, December 9, 2017 the Kelton House became a stop on the Discovery District Trolley Hop! During the hop, families are able to enjoy seasonal delights for free throughout the Discovery District, including the Columbus Library, Hills Market Downtown, the Thurber House, and of course, the Kelton House.

This year, the Kelton House had over 150 visitors in the short three hour event. Once inside, visitors were able to take a brief tour of the downstairs and view our Victorian Christmas décor. Younger visitors were able to participate in Victorian children's activities like making snowflake ornaments from paper and a "Jacob's Ladder" game, while adults sipped on warm wassail made from apple cider and spices.

### Kelton House Hits Savannah for 40th Anniversary Celebration



In the late 1970s, after the Junior League had voted to take on the enormous project of restoring the home of the late Grace Bird Kelton, the JLC volunteers consulted with local, regional, and national authorities on historic preservation. They found out that Savannah, GA was one of the first communities to undertake the challenges of restoring its historic district, under the leadership of Jim Williams and Leopold Adler II. They decided to visit Savannah and were especially interested in consulting with Jim Williams, whose home, Mercer House, bore a striking resemblance to the home of Grace Kelton.

The trip to Savannah took place in 1976 with 20 members in attendance. The most memorable part of the trip was a cocktail party at the home of Jim Williams, who later was referred to as the notorious Jim Williams, subject of the book and film, *Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil*. Jim Williams also visited Columbus, where he toured the home of Grace Kelton and advised the Junior League on appropriate approaches to preservation.

As part of the Junior League celebration of 40 years of dedication to the Kelton House, the 40th Anniversary Committee organized an anniversary trip to Savannah this past April! 15 people participated in the trip, which included a trip to the infamous Mercer House, Juliette Lowe's home, and yummy cuisine each day. The trip began with a cocktail party at Georgeanne Reuter's home in Hilton Head to replicate the cocktail party at the home of Jim Williams in 1976. The 40th anniversary celebration team is working hard to plan more celebration events like this trip throughout the next few years.

# Get Involved at the Kelton House!

## Celebrate the 40th Anniversary with a Gift to the Kelton House Endowment

For individuals wishing to leave a legacy of history and education in central Ohio, The Kelton House offers an exceptional opportunity through its endowment fund. The Junior League Kelton House endowment is receiving fresh attention in view of a new fund established by Georgetanne and Mike Reuter to augment the Junior League Kelton House Endowment (Fund 1306).

Both endowments are invested and managed by the Columbus Foundation. The Junior League Kelton House Fund is overseen by the JLC Investment Committee composed of both active and sustaining members. A portion of the Kelton House endowment earnings that accrued over the past 16 years is now beginning to support Kelton House preservation and programming expenses in accordance with Foundation guidelines.

The Junior League Kelton House endowment offers an exciting opportunity to advance the growth and development of the Kelton House Museum and Garden and ensure that Kelton House continues to offer underground railroad education programs and preservation history to a diverse group of individuals from Central Ohio children to visitors from around the world, perpetuating its heritage as a jewel in the Columbus cultural landscape.

## Kelton House Docents

Each year over 8,500 people visit the Kelton House for one of our tours. For most, these tours are led by a docent. As a result, the Kelton House is always looking for more League members to attend Docent Training and become active docents. Starting in 2015, docenting became a primary League placement. Once your training is over, docenting provides a steady stream of volunteer hours.

Don't know anything about the museum or history? Neither does anyone else when they start! The docent training program and other docents will teach you everything you need to know. The museum isn't relevant to the League? The Kelton House directly supports our mission of promoting volunteerism and developing women by hosting a variety of educational events throughout the year. Each year, school teachers from Franklin and nearby counties bring over 3,500 children to the Kelton House to learn about the Underground Railroad. Social studies content knowledge is essential for building academic vocabulary, analytical thinking and research skills. In fact, studies show that up to 55% of an individual's academic vocabulary is gained from the social studies.

Girl Scouts and other visitors learn about the amazing Kelton women who serve as role models for all of us. These women were the leaders of their day: women like Laura Brace Kelton, who founded the first kindergarten programs in Columbus and served on the Board of Directors of Children Hospital in a time when women were expected to be home cooking dinner, or Belle Coit Kelton, who led the women's suffrage movement in Ohio and counted Elizabeth Cady Stanton as one of her close friends, and then there's Grace Kelton, who ran a successful interior design business in Columbus and was selected to work for Jackie Kennedy when she redecorated the White House.

Aren't good at public speaking? The Kelton House is the perfect place to sharpen your skills. Your first tours will be given with a trained docent at your side, for moral support and to field any questions you can't answer yet. Sunday tours are usually given to small groups of 10 or less.

What is the best part of being a Kelton House docent? The clothes of course! We all played dress-up as children. Here is our chance to do it as adults. The Kelton House has a supply of costumes and has hired a seamstress to make more. Corsets are NOT required. All you need to provide is the shoes.
